Lawyers for WBZ-TV (Ch. 4) argued in court yesterday for the release of tape-recorded police statements by three witnesses who implicated William Bennett in the killing of Carol Stuart and her baby. In arguing against release of the statements, Suffolk prosecutors suggested that a grand jury probing the deaths may yet decide that Bennett was somehow involved, despite a public pronouncement by District Attorney Newman Flanagan two months ago to the contrary. Superior Court Judge Charles Grabau ordered the hearing continued until this morning to allow the attorney general and US attorney, who are investigating allegations that police had coerced witnesses into implicating Bennett, an opportunity to argue their positions. Philip Brown, a WBZ lawyer, said the statements are subject to disclosure under the public records law.
